From the Pastor

We are rapidly moving toward Lent and the boxes containing our Christmas decorations are still sitting in the front hall of the parsonage, waiting for transit to the attic until next Christmas. It strikes me as odd how so much of our lives run together; how we are barely finished with one activity when the next one demands its time. That may be part of the reason why it is so difficult to live neatly, compartmentalizing the areas and activities of our lives. Perhaps we are not meant to do so, but it is supremely human, I think, to try.

This year, Lent will begin as always with Ash Wednesday on March 9. We will hold our annual Ash Wednesday service that evening at 7:00 PM. I hope as many of you as possible will attend in order to make a meaningful entrance into this holiest of seasons.

I believe we have a lot of difficulty with Lent. During this time (the six weeks leading up to Easter) we are called upon to be introspective and penitent. It is a time of self-examination and a time to set things right in our living, our relationships, and our faith. During these forty days we are called upon to increase our understanding of Christ's sacrifice and His resurrection. This year's Easter service will include a renewal of our baptismal vows and a recommitment to the Christian life. I pray that this time of repentance and renewal will be a powerful one for all of us.

How can this happen for us? Here are a few suggestions:

- 1. Set aside this period of time to examine and evaluate your life as a Christian.
- 2. Move toward spiritual renewal, which is possible only if we are willing to repent for our sins and change our lives for God.
- 3. Try a new way of living during this time. You might want to consider fasting, doing good deeds, taking time for prayer and reflection, studying Scripture or increased worship attendance.
- 4. Make a special commitment to give up something for the greater good. For example, watch less television or forego some favorite sports events; give up some social events; eliminate weekend trips so that you can be present at worship with the gathered community. In place of the time you would spend doing these things, consider making time to read, study and think about your faith, talking with your family and/or friends about your thoughts. You might also consider helping others through church or charitable activities. The point is to change our priorities.
 - 5. Make prayer a daily habit.
 - 6. Read the Bible daily.

These suggestions may help you to delve deeper into your faith than you have ever been able to before. When we observe a Lent filled with meaning, our celebration of Easter, when all has been accomplished, can be a life changing event.

Please let me know how I can be of help to you on your journey. That's what pastors are for, after all. May God bless you along the way.

Forgiveness BRACELET


Jesus died on the cross to forgive our sins, and he tells us to forgive other people, too. Make and wear this craft as a reminder that you are forgiven — and should be forgiving.

What you need:

- Clear plastic bottle (about 16 oz.)
- An adult to help
- Scissors
- Construction paper
- Permanent black marker
- Glue or clear tape
- Thin ribbon or yarn
- Small hole punch

What you do:

- 1. Remove any label from the bottle. Have an adult help you cut the bottle in half, width-wise. At the middle, cut out two identical half-inch-wide strips.
- 2. Cut out paper the same size as the plastic strips.
- 3. On the paper, write "Forgive, and you will be forgiven" (Luke 6:37, NIV).
- 4. Place the paper between the two plastic strips.
- 5. Cut and glue the ribbon or yarn to run along the top and bottom of the verse, framing the words.
- 6. Punch a hole at each end, through all three layers.
- 7. Tie the bracelet to your wrist with ribbon or yarn.

The Significance of Lent

Lent is the fourth season of the Christian year. Its length is the 40 days preceding Easter Day, not counting Sundays. This means Lent always begins on a Wednesday, known as Ash Wednesday.

Lent commemorates Jesus' fast and temptation in the wilderness of Judea Province, which, according to the Gospel, lasted 40 days. Just as Jesus confronted his temptations during these 40 days, Lent helps Christians focus on our most basic need as sinners: forgiveness.

The only way our Lord's forgiving power can become effective in our lives is by our taking the initiative to confront our sins, confess them and repent of them. In short, Lent is a season of penitence.

Some Christians fast during Lent. This denial of bodily comforts can help encourage self-reflection about the need for Jesus' forgiveness.

Repent - a Worthy Word for Lent

What pops into your mind when you hear the word "repent"? Is it a dark and somber word for you, perhaps reminding you of John the Baptist's shouting for people to repent and be baptized?

What does the word "repent" mean anyway? Literally, it means to stop the way one is going, turn around, and then walk in the opposite direction. It refers to turning away from sin and shallow living and to begin walking through life following God's direction.

Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday (March 9, 2011, is an opportunity to check our spiritual condition, to repent (if needed) and to walk more faithfully with our Lord.

If we take Lent seriously, we can begin to discover a new vision for life – a more joyous way to live. Lent can enable us to discover the immeasurable benefits of living the Christian life passionately.
