From the Pastor

Those of you who know that my beloved husband, Wally, died last month will not be surprised to know that I find myself in the midst of difficult days. Anyone who has ever lost a much loved husband or wife knows what it is like to wander through the days, reminding yourself to breathe and keeping yourself together because you know you have to. These are not easy days, but I am deeply moved to find that they are, indeed, days of strong faith and trust in God. I am not surprised at this, merely immensely assured that God is with me and all of us who loved Wally without bounds.

As I thought about what to write for this month's newsletter, I kept coming back to the book I always recommend to those who are grieving the loss of a spouse: *A Grief Observed*, by C. S. Lewis. I have read this book many times, but never before as a widow. I am gratified to know that it stands up to the reality I now face.

C.S. Lewis is my favorite Christian author. His works transcend every other work I have read. He has an amazing insight into the human condition and the ways in which we are lifted up by the God who loves and saves us. Lewis' step-son, Douglas Gresham, writes of this book:

*A Grief Observed is not an ordinary book. In a sense it is not a book at all; it is, rather, the passionate result of a brave man turning to face his agony and examine it in order that he might further understand what is required of us in living this life in which we have to expect the pain and sorrow of the loss of those whom we love.*

In those deceptively simple words we are introduced to a magnificent and masterly walk through Lewis' grief upon the death of his wife, Joy. In his own words, Lewis holds up the mirror of his experience and invites us to try to understand what he is trying to teach. Although I am not yet finished with this reading of the book, I am already far enough into its pages to know that it is providing comfort, hope and the knowledge that my own experience is not unusual or in any way abnormal. When everything else seems to be topsy-turvy, it is important to know this.

As days pass, I am anticipating many adjustments in the way I am experiencing Wally's death. Thank you for being willing to go with me along the way. You are welcome companions.

# HERO Sandwich

## What you need:

- An adult to help

- Seasonings (salt, pepper, oregano)
- Italian crusty bread (six inches per person)
- Mayonnaise
- Sliced meat
- Sliced cheese
- Sliced tomato
- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Toothpicks
- Tape



## What you do:

1. Drizzle shredded lettuce with oil and vinegar; sprinkle with seasonings.
2. Cut bread in half lengthwise and spread mayo on both halves.
3. On bottom half, layer meats, cheese, tomato and lettuce.
4. Top with other half of bread. Cut in half.
5. Cut paper into small triangles. Write your favorite Bible heroes' names on them.
6. Tape the triangles to toothpicks to make pennants. Stick in sandwich halves. Enjoy!
